2. **Public Comment:** Jen Quallick reported that there is a pending issue regarding the proposed development of an area off Ridgewood Road that is going to be discussed at the next MAC meeting and at the County Community Development Office in Martinez on February 12. She also reported that the roundabout planning is on track.
3. **Review and Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes.** Motion to approve of the last meeting's minutes by Diane Barley and seconded by Joe Rubay; motion carried unanimously.
4. **Treasurer's Report:** None given, Steve Nelson was out of state concerning a family matter.

6. **Community Organization Reports**
 - A. Alamo Improvement Association (AIA) – Joe Rubay reported that the AIA has voted unanimously to follow whatever of Walnut Creek and Danville decide to do regarding the regulation of Cannabis.
 - B. Alamo Rotary Club – Diane Barley reported the Easter Egg hunt is scheduled for March 31 and it will be bigger and better and Rotary meeting will be now held at Forli's.

8. Police Report

- A. CHP Officer : Officer Jason Joiner reported the recent DUI related deaths and injuries his department and colleagues have suffered, and reminds us how dangerous our officers face every day. The CHP is taking a zero tolerance position on DUI's which was applauded by the committee. Officer Joiner also gave the committee a helpful handout regarding the new carpool lane rules.
- B. Deputy Jesus Topete: There were no reported home burglaries in the month of January. There was a reported Identity theft and the responsible was arrested and charged with felony offenses. There has also been a noticeable increase in car burglaries, so residents are reminded not to leave items of value in their vehicles. He also reminded the community that if you encounter suspicious activity you can contact the Sheriff's office on its non-emergency number 925-646-2441. For emergencies call 911.

9. On-Going Items

- A. ALPR cameras: Lieutenant Jason Haynes reported that there were 2.1 million license plates read in January, which led to three stolen cars being recovered. By all accounts, the ALPR cameras are proving to be a valuable asset to our local law enforcement efforts.
- B. Overtime deputies, hiring freeze, mandatory overtime, CSO, Share a deputy. - No Action at this time.
- C. Patrol vehicle. 6469 miles/2015 model.
- D. Equipment updates and needs of Deputy Topete and volunteers – No needs at this time.
- E. Crossing guard on Hemme Ave. – The committee voted unanimously to approve the contribution of \$7500 for the crossing guard at Hemme Avenue for the remainder of the school year. Next year, the committee would like to see the San Ramon Valley School District pay for their own crossing guard.
- F. Roundabout; Modified/enhanced crosswalks downtown – The committee wants to continue to focus on beautification of crosswalks.

10. Future Items

- Star Chase-GPS tracking system on evading suspects.
- Traffic Calming, Beautification, Parking
- A more prominent sign for the Sheriff's Substation
