MINUTES FROM MARCH 5, 2018 MEETING

1. Call to order: Chair Joe Motta called the meeting to order at 5:04PM.

Roll Call: Anthony Rocca- Secretary, Members Present: Diane Barley, Karen McPherson, Joe Motta, Bill Nelson, (and two additional folks?), Guest: LT Jason Haynes, Deputy Jesus Topete, Jen Quallick, Field Representative for Supervisor Candace Anderson.

2. Public Comment: Jen Quallick reported that there is an Alamo liaison meeting on March 19th at 8:30PM at the Supervisors office: 309 Diablo Rd, Danville, CA.

The Alamo Summit Project had a "no show" at the planning commission meeting. An appeal has been filed. All in attendance are against the project.

Underground storage tanks at Hemme Park have seen concerns posted on "next door". The park has been deemed safe per recent inspections.

Bill Nelson reported that Jo-Anne Hirsch had brain surgery and all went well.

3. Review and Approval of prior meeting minutes: Previous P2B Advisory Committee were reviewed with "all in favor". Joe Motta suggested motion to approve and seconded by Diane Barley. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Treasurer's Report: None given.

5. Community Organizations Reports:

A. Diane Barley reported that the Alamo Rotary Club will hold its annual Easter egg hunt on March 31st at from 9-10AM at Livorna Park. Deputy Jesus Topete reported that his patrol car will be on site and plenty of Sheriff Stickers will be available to the kids.

B. Diane Barley stated that the Alamo Rotary Club's adopt a highway project that maintains both Stone Valley Road and Danville Boulevard was recently completed. Diane stated that the project is maintained by Alamo Rotarian, Anthony Rocca.

C. Jen Quallick reported that at the recent MAC meeting that the cannabis ordinance goes to the board on April 10th. The board expressed no interest in selling and/or distribution of said substance. No outdoor grow requested due to smell/odor. Eight motions of "no" recorded.

6. Police Report:

Deputy Jesus Topete: There was a report of a residential burglary on Los Alamos Court with windows smashed and the home ransacked. DNA gathered at the location showed positive signs of a male suspect. A search is currently underway for the perpetrator. The ALPR cameras tracked the subject to another residential burglary in the town of Danville. The suspect was seen by a neighbor. A car pursuit on Livorna Road was noted after a traffic stop was initiated. The car crashed and the subject foot-bailed and was apprehended. ALPR cameras tracked the subject to adjacent burglaries in Walnut Creek.

7. On-Going Items:

A. Lieutenant Jason Haynes reported that ALPR Cameras, DNA and Software are helping with crime research in the area. Cross-Agency verification and other statistics with mutual agencies are deemed very helpful. Diane Barley inquired about what "1743" was (house check).

B. Lieutenant Jason Haynes reported that APPR cameras are working well. One has been replaced under warranty. Noted that crime mapping software has been very helpful. Star Chase GPS Tracking system on evading suspects is on the agenda (versus high speed car chases).

8. Future Items:

-Increase the parcel tax?

-Crime appears to have dropped off versus previous reports (kudos given to LE).

-Bring on another deputy to the Alamo area?

-Put parcel tax on the ballot? East of RHCC would need to be part of helping to pay.

-Round-about is 35% complete on the design phase. 2020 break ground per Jen Quallick.

-Diane Barley stated the P2B should consider looking at cross walks and light poles post Round-about installation/completion (to be revisited at next meeting).

-No additional need per Lieutenant Jason Haynes.

-Ballot measure for second Deputy proposed.

-Substation move is off the table for Sheriff Sub-station as the previous firehouse is now off of the market.

-A more visible sign with lighting proposed for Alamo Substation (paid for by P2B per Joe Motta?)

-Crossing guards resolved (remove from agenda).
