6. Police report:

Deputy Jesus Topete reported there were 32 total incidents during the month. No burglaries and no residential incidents during this report period. Three major incidents were solved quickly by the LPR cameras:

-Rite Aid Store- Robbery

-Wells Fargo – Strong Arm Robbery

-Stolen Vehicle-Danville Blvd/ Livorna Rd

All three were solved quickly with assistance of the LPR camera system

A fourth incident which began as a chase in Danville was culminated in Alamo with assistance from the LPR camera system.

Deputy Topete and Lt Haynes indicated these felony incidents would most likely not have been solved prior to the installation of the LPR camera system. It was explained to the board that investigating officers now can use historical LPR data to search for a particular vehicle to see how that vehicle location corresponds to other crime incidents. LPR cameras are a very good tool for investigating crimes. As time goes on they will be even more valuable.

Chairman Motta suggested the P2b board forward a letter to Sheriff David Livingston thanking the Sheriff and his department for supporting the installation of the LPR camera system in Alamo. The residents of Alamo are very pleased with the results. We are also grateful for the expert assistance and guidance provided by Lt Jason Haynes as we navigated through the difficult process of raising funds and acquiring the cameras.

Quote# 06212018VHBS1 dated June 21, 2018 is for two systems SCPMT-1B3.0 including installation, training, unlimited projectiles for 12 months, unlimited GPS data for 12 months, 24 month warranty.

The motion was made by Joe Motta to purchase the two systems at a cost up to \$15,000 and install both per the direction of the Sheriff's office.
