Meeting Minutes

Monday, October 7, 2013

180 Alamo Plaza, Alamo

The meeting was called to order at 5:05PM by Chair Joe Motta. In attendance were Joe Motta, Diane Barley, David Dolter, Anne Struthers, Steve Nelson, Cesare Ciatti, Bill Nelson, and Chris Bura (alternate).

County Staff present: Donna Maxwell, Supervisor Andersen's office, Deputy Carson. Guests present: CHP Officer Pruitt, Ray Riordan (City of San Ramon), Jeff Heibel (Danville), Katie and Paul Salvoni (Alamo CERT) and Sharon Burke (LAFCO).

Agenda was amended to move CHP Officer Pruitt to the beginning of the meeting and approved.

Officer Pruitt spoke about some accidents that had been recently occurring around schools and addressed the issues and dangers he perceived around Alamo School recently.

Speakers presented the status of the collaboration of the APSAC and the SR Valley Preparedness committee and the newly coordinated efforts. The PAC includes the SRV Unified, the Fire District the Town of Danville and the City of San Ramon. The group is expanding to include Roundhill P5 and the Alamo MAC. Dave Dolter volunteered to be the liaison for the APSAC. Policy Advisor is Supervisor Andersen, Technical Advisor is Ray Riordan, Community Advisors are Katie and Paul Salvoni. The PAC will report quarterly back to the APSAC. A grant has been received for \$55K to produce a video on how to evacuate a residential facility. There are 72 residential facilities in our area. The video will be on Youtube. The 56th CERT class has ended; there are 1260 trained community members so far. Drill scheduled for Nov. 2nd.

Ray Riordan gave more information on the programs available through the PAC. Ken Bigley will report next month.

Chris Bura was introduced and welcomed as the newest member of the APSAC as an alternate.

Motion (Barley/Ciatti) to approve minutes as presented. Passed

Treasurer's Report – Steve Nelson reported that there was \$444,210 cash on hand. The traffic Fund had \$49,892.26; revenues were \$209,040.

Community Organization Reports

AIA – D. Barley reported that the AIA was reviewing the proposal for a gym at the SR Methodist Church in Alamo. There is a meeting regarding Zoning Administration on 10/21. This issue was already approved by the MAC but there are issues causing further review.

Chamber of Commerce – D. Barley reported a possible merging with the Danville Chamber of Commerce.

Rotary – D. Barley reported that the Alamo Music Festival, 9/7/13, went well.

Landscaping at the 680 freeway entrance on Stone Valley Road is being maintained by volunteers and some plants need replacement.

MAC – Struthers reported that the MAC had not yet met; meeting on 10/8/13.

Police Report (see handout)

Deputy Carson reported. The use of overtime to increase staff visibility and coverage during the start of the school year was very effective. There are holiday events coming up that may need overtime to staff appropriately.

Motion (S. Nelson/Dolter) to extend 70 hours a month of overtime through December for Sheriff's deputies. Recommendation Approved.

Motion (B.Nelson/Dolter) to authorize purchase of an additional 28 hours of overtime for the Alamo Tree Lighting Festival. Recommendation Approved.

Motion (W.Nelson/Barley) to authorize purchase of volunteer safety/identification vests up to \$450. Recommendation Approved.

Motion (Struthers/B.Nelson) to authorize purchase of an "easy up" display tent and table throw up to \$1200, with printing affixed "Alamo Police Services".

Recommendation Approved.

Ongoing Items

Discussion ensued regarding the inclusion of P6 into the APSAC and the challenge of merging two separate entities charged with "enhanced police protection".

Motion (Barley/Ciatti) to form a subcommittee to explore the possibility through Supervisor Andersen's office and create a report to APSAC for the next meeting.

Approved. Bill Nelson and Dave Dolter volunteered to head the committee.

Car Show – there was a slight altercation, but it was handled well by Dep. Carson.

Signage - Signs on Danville Blvd. identifying "Alamo" are missing.

Motion (Struthers/Nelson) to replace the missing "Alamo" signs (including the correct population) on Danville Blvd. Approved.

MAC and collaboration was discussed. There are now two committees to explore the AOB options that were presented and approved. One committee is for "Downtown" options and one will explore "School" area issues.

Placement of the speed signs is still being determined.

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Discussion was initiated on Safety and Personnel issues; to be placed on the Agenda for next meeting.
