Sharon Burke spoke to let people know of the LAFCO agenda item that would annex all of Alamo into the boundaries of CSA R7-A. Such an annexation would not result in any additional taxes being assessed, but rather a redistribution of the current taxes collected currently.

Asst. Fire Chief Steve Hart said that the Fire District was going through the due diligence process with the bids received for the demolition and grading of the new site. With a projected start date of 6/18/2012, this part of the process is anticipated to take 6 weeks. The RFP for an architect for the design of the new fire station has been sent out for bids.
